ORDINANCE
AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING WEIGHT
RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN TOWNSHIP
ROADS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF
MORRIS.

WHEREAS, certain Township Roads within the Township of Morris are good and sufficient for ordinary use and travel, but are not adequately based or constructed to the extent that heavy empty or loaded vehicles could use the same without inflicting damage which would involve substantial repairs by the Township.

THEREFORE, be it enacted and ordained by the Supervisors of Morris Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for a motor vehicle, truck, trailer or semi-trailer of a gross weight in excess of six(6) tons including contents and cargo to use or travel or operate upon any posted Township Road, except for those motor vehicles, trucks, trailers or semi-trailer making local deliveries within the Township.

SECTION II. Permits in exceptional cases for a reasonable cause and to a limited extent justified under the circumstances, may be granted by the Township Supervisors in advance of any such use, travel or operation upon such road by the aforesaid vehicles.

SECTION III. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined a sum not exceeding One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars and shall be liable for the cost of such proceedings. In default of the payment of the fine and costs any such offender may be sentenced to imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not exceeding ten (10) days.
